
Highlights of Saskatoon's activities

- Saskatoon installed 90 solar thermal panels on the Lawson Civic Centre and 72 solar thermal panels on the Harry Bailey Aquatic Centre.
- Saskatoon has established a target of reducing corporate (municipal) emissions to 10% below 1990 levels by 2013, matched with a target to reduce community emissions to 6% below 1990 levels by 2013.
- The city has added eight diesel-electric hybrid buses to its fleet, and a green fleet policy is being developed.
- Saskatoon is a member of the Partners for Climate Protection program, a network of Canadian municipal governments that have committed to reducing greenhouse gases and acting on climate change.
- Saskatoon's Green Energy Park at the landfill site is proposed to include a number of renewable and/or low impact electrical generation facilities, including a Tall Wind Turbine, Landfill Gas Power Generation Facility, and Turboexpander Power Generation Facility (in conjunction with SaskEnergy), with potential to add fuel cells and heat recovery generation in the future.
